

Information to authors of articles for publications in the collection «Actual problems of international relations and global development»

The collection «Actual problems of international relations and global development» is a scientific publication of the Center for International Studies of the Faculty of International Relations of the Belarusian State University, with a frequency of 1 time per year.

The purpose of the publication is to disseminate the results of Belarusian and foreign studies in the field of history of international relations and foreign policy, political problems of international relations of global and regional development.

For publications in the collection, the author must provide:

- an **article** in Russian, Belarusian or English with a volume of up to 35,000 characters with spaces (including *References*), in accordance with the requirements specified below;
- an **article review**.

All the above information is **put in one file** with the obligatory indication in its title of the author's name and surname. The required document must be submitted for publication in the 9th release of the collection before **September 15, 2021** by e-mail centis@bsu.by; protchenko@bsu.by or via the CIS FIR website at the link <https://fir.bsu.by/faculty/centres/international-studies/sbornik-priem> (ARTICLES ACCEPTANCE). The release of the collection is planned at the end of the year.

The decision to publish an article is made by the editorial board. Publications are free.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

The article should:

- be relevant and comply with the subject of the collection;
- represent an independent study;
- rely on the works of domestic and foreign specialists and keep relevant references (at least 15 references).

Manuscripts are provided in .doc or .docx (Word) format. The format of the A4 page, font 16 pt. *Times New Roman*, margins – 2 cm on each

side, indent of the first line – 1.25; the distance between the lines is 1 interval.

The title of the article is centered in capital letters.

The author is centered in italics.

References, as well as page footnotes: font 12, line spacing 1, without indent.

ARTICLE STRUCTURE

DOI (*Digital Object Identifier* is a unique standardized digital code that is assigned to any materials posted on the Internet) is put down by the editorial board in the process of preparing the collection for publication.

Title. The title of the article should be as brief as possible.

Surname and name of the author, place of work.

The Abstract (250-300 words). The abstract should be informative, without common words, reflect the content of the article, objectives, methods of conducting research, research results, scientific value.

Keywords – up to 10 words.

For citations.

The text of the article. The following sections are necessary in the text: introduction, purpose of the article, review of literature, research methods, results and discussion, conclusion, acknowledgements, *References*.

References. References are made by the model of the 8th edition (<https://fir.bsu.by/faculty/centres/international-studies/sbornik-arhiv>). It is not recommended to include anonymous sources and regulatory documents (regulations, laws, instructions, etc.) in *References*; pages footnotes should be given to them.

References in the text, tables, and figure captions are indicated by arabic numerals in square brackets, and pages are indicated (if necessary). If the reference includes several sources, then they are separated by a

semicolon inside the square brackets: [4, p. 15; 5, p. 123]. Semantic footnotes are given page by page.

It is not recommended to include in *References* anonymous sources and normative documents (regulations, laws, instructions, etc.); you should give them footnotes. There should not be given links to works and textbooks, hard-to-reach, unpublished, short-circuited, as well as local and popular sources: dissertation abstracts and dissertations, newspapers, unpublished reports.

In *References*, it is not recommended to repeat the same source several times, indicating the pages (*Ibid.*, p. 15). Such duplication does not correctly provide information about the number of sources used. If the journal provides a citation sample for its articles, this information should be used.
