

**INFORMATION TO AUTHORS OF ARTICLES FOR PUBLICATIONS
in the collection
“CURRENT PROBLEMS OF INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS
AND GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT. ISSUE 10”**

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For publication in the collection, the author submits the following documents to the editorial board:

1. An article in Russian, Belarusian or English with a volume of up to 35 000 characters with spaces (taking into account all metadata, References, etc.), designed in accordance with the requirements for the design of the article indicated below.
2. An extract from the minutes of the meeting of the department (scientific department or other structure) on the recommendation of the article for publication.
3. An internal review is required for the teaching staff. Authors who do not have an academic degree, as well as students, undergraduates, postgraduates, are required to provide an internal and external reviews.
4. Screenshot from the website <https://antiplagiat.ru> with the results of checking the article for plagiarism (the originality of the text must be at least 80%).

All information is sent in one file. The last name of the author must be indicated in the file name.

For publication in the 10th issue of the collection (release in 2022), the necessary set of documents is sent by September 15, 2022 to the e-mail centis@bsu.by; protchenko@bsu.by or submitted via the CIS FMO website at the link <https://fir.bsu.by/faculty/centres/international-studies/sbornik-priem> (ACCEPTANCE OF ARTICLES). Accompanying documents are accepted at the address: Leningradskaya St., 20, room 1109.

The decision to publish the article is made by the editorial board. Publications are free of charge.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR PUBLICATION

Article must:

- be relevant and correspond to the subject of the collection;
- be an independent study;
- be based on the works of domestic and foreign specialists and contain relevant references (**at least 10**).

The manuscript is provided in the .doc or .docx format. The page format is A4, Times New Roman font 16 pt, margins – 2 cm on each side, indent of the first line – 1.25; distance between lines – 1 interval.

The **volume of the article** should not exceed 15–18 pages, including text, References and up to 5 non-text objects (diagrams, photographs, tables). The orientation of the pages is bookish.

References, as well as page footnotes: font 12, line spacing 1, without indent.

INFORMATION ABOUT THE ARTICLE

DOI (Digital Object Identifier is a unique standardized digital code that is assigned to any materials posted on the Internet) is put down by the editorial board in the process of preparing the collection for publication.

TITLE. Center alignment in **BOLD UPPERCASE** letters. The title of the article should be as brief as possible and not repeat the topic of the dissertation research.

AUTHOR. Initials and surname: center alignment, **BOLD UPPERCASE ITALICS**. Affiliation – *in italics*.

The title of the work and information about the author(s) (place of work) are given at the beginning of the article and are drawn up STRICTLY according to the following pattern:

Abstract. (200–250 words). The abstract should be informative, without common words, reflect the content of the article, objectives, methods of conducting research, research results, scientific value.

Keywords. Without indentation, up to 10 words, separated by semicolons. Example:

Key words: Greater Eurasian Partnership; EAEU; EU; RCEP; Eurasia; integration; “One Belt, One Road”; Shanghai Cooperation Organization.

For citations. Example:

THE TEXT OF THE ARTICLE. The design of the text of the article: Times New Roman font 16 pt, margins – 2 cm on each side, the indent of the first line – 1.25; the distance between the lines – 1 interval. Up to 5 non-text objects (diagrams, photos, tables) are allowed.

The text of the article should be divided into logical parts containing subheadings. The design with the allocation of the following structural parts is welcome: **Introduction. Research methodology. Literature Review. Results. Discussions. Conclusions. Acknowledgements.**

TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS FOR MATERIALS.

Quotation mark pattern: "text".

Do not confuse the hyphen (-), dash (–), and minus (−) signs. It is necessary to use a short dash (–); a dash is placed between the digits without spaces. For example: 1–2, XX–XXI. Decimal numbers should be specified with a comma, not with a dot. For example: 1,5 times.

When writing initials, it is necessary to use an unbroken space (CTRL+SHIFT+Space). For example: A. A. Yankovsky, A. V. Alexandrov.

Tables. The word *Table 1* is written in italics and placed in a separate line on the right, font 12 pt.; the name of the table is printed in a straight font 12 pt. on the next line on the right; the dot is not necessary. You should not go horizontally outside the table.

The names of the graph tables (header) are drawn in a straight font of 12 pt., the text in the cells is centered. The body of the table is designed in font 12 pt. At the bottom, the tables are separated from the main text by an interval of 6 pt. If the article contains one table, then it is not numbered and the word "Table" is not put in the title. Example:

Table 1 shows examples of letters of the Greek alphabet.

At least 10 sources !!!

References (also page-by-page footnotes) are in 12 pt font, without indentation. References to sources are numbered in the order of their first mention in the text and are drawn up on the model of the 9th issue of the collection (<https://fir.bsu.by/faculty/centres/international-studies/publikatsii-centra>).

DO NOT PUT A DASH AS A DIVIDING SIGN.

References in the text, tables and figure captions are indicated by Arabic numerals in square brackets, and pages are indicated if necessary, e.g. [1, p. 27]. If the link includes several sources, then they are separated by semicolons inside square brackets: [4, p. 15; 5, p. 123]. Semantic footnotes are given page by page.

Sources in Latin (French, German and other languages) are indicated in the original language (English translation is indicated in square brackets). At the end, an indication is given of the language of the article (if it is not English). Example:

1. Ellingsen, A. E., Wilhelmsen, I. (2002). Sykdomsangst blant medisinske jusstudenter [Fear of illness among medical and law students]. In: *Tidsskr Nor Laegeforen*, 122 (8), p. 785–787. (In Norw.).

If the article is written in Cyrillic (in Russian, Belarusian) or hieroglyphs, the source must be **transliterated and translated into English**. To transliterate the text in accordance with the BS standard, you can use the link <https://translit.net/ru/bsi/>. The English translation is indicated in square brackets [...], at the end of the bibliographic description an indication is given of the language of the article (In Russ.). For example:

NOTA BENE! Normative documents (resolutions, laws, instructions, etc.), lecture courses, textbooks that are hard-to-access, unpublished as well as local and popular sources: dissertations and abstracts of dissertations, newspaper materials, unpublished reports are issued in the form of **page footnotes**.

If the journal gives a citation sample of its articles, this information should be used. You cannot arbitrarily shorten the names of journals. You can check the recommended abbreviation in the ISSN center's list: List of Title World Abbreviations (LTWA) <http://www.issn.org/services/online-services/access-to-the-ltwa/>. If there are no recommendations for reduction, their full spelling should be given. You cannot specify the name of the journal by an abbreviation if it is not provided by the journal.

INFORMATION ABOUT THE ARTICLE IN RUSSIAN

THE TITLE OF THE ARTICLE IN RUSSIAN is centered in **BOLD CAPITAL** letters.

THE INITIALS and **SURNAME** of the author are centered in **BOLD UPPERCASE ITALICS**, affiliation in English is given in *italics*.

Abstract (250–300 words).

Keywords (up to 10).

For citations. Example:
