The Faculty of International Relations of the Belarusian State University is holding the XV Scientific and Practical Conference of Young Scientists of the Faculty of International Relations «International Relations: History, Theory, Practice» and invites researchers and specialists in international relations, international law, world economy, international tourism, customs, intercultural communication, oriental studies, Eurasian studies and the development of the PRC to participate.

During the scientific meeting, the subject of discussion will be the priority problems of international relations for the Republic of Belarus in the field of politics, economics and law; topical issues of the activities of the customs service of the Republic of Belarus; current problems and prospects of international tourism; problems of intercultural communication and oriental studies; topical issues of integration and comparative studies and comprehensive study of China's development; problems and prospects for the development of international logistics.

We invite to participate in the conference:

1) persons who do not have an academic degree under the age of 35;

2) persons who have an academic degree of Candidate of Science up to 35 years of age or Doctor of Science up to 40 years of age;

3) postgraduate students;

4) master's students;

5) 3rd and 4th year students, provided that the co-author of the thesis is the scientific supervisor.

No more than one individually written materials and one co-authored material shall be accepted from one person.

Registration

To participate in the conference, you must register using the link no later than **January, 28.**

Materials must be uploaded in .doc format, .docx through the electronic registration form. This option is final and cannot be replaced. PhD and Master's students must also attach a review signed by their supervisor (scanned version) in .pdf format.

The file with the material should be named by the author's surname and section number, if there are several authors - by the surname of the first author: Ivanov_4.doc or Иванов_4.doc

A personal invitation to participate in the conference will be sent by e-mail until February 4, 2025.

Abstracts are not accepted if:

- Submitted after the deadline;
- Prepared in violation of the requirements;
- Containing elements of plagiarism (originality of the text – at least 70%).

The Organizing Committee has the right to select the submitted reports with their subsequent editing. Rejected materials are not returned to the authors.

Materials will be published after the conference.

Participation in the conference is free of charge. Travel, accommodation and meals are to be paid by the sending party.

When registering before the conference, you must provide a copy of the abstract with a personal signature.

Materials of postgraduate and master's students must be signed by the supervisor.

REQUIREMENTS FOR CONFERENCE MATERIALS

The conference materials must meet the requirements of scientific novelty and relevance, validity and practical significance. Materials are submitted in electronic form in .doc or .docx format. The file with the material should be named by the author's surname and section number, if there are several authors - by the surname of the first author: Ivanov_4.doc or ИВАНОВ_4.doc

The order of presentation of the text of the publication (examples are given below)

1. The title of the article should consist of no more than 10-12 words.

Parameters: font size — 14 pt, style — bold, straight, all letters are lowercase, centered.

2. Initials and surname of the author(s). Parameters: font size — 12 pt, style — light, italic, centered, without an indent, the interval after is one line.

3. Affiliation: names of organizations in which the author works, address (street, house number), zip code, city, country, e-mail address. If there are several authors of the publication, then the information is repeated for each author.

Parameters: font size — 12 pt, style — light, italic, centered, without an indent, the interval after is one line.

4. Abstract is a brief accurate summary of the content of the article, including the main factual information and conclusions of the described work. An abstract, as a rule, contains from 100-150 words. It includes the relevance of the research topic, the statement of the problem, the results and key conclusions. The main characteristics of the abstract: informativeness; meaningfulness; structure; quality of language; compactness.

The traditional drawbacks of the author's abstracts are incomplete reflection of the content of the article and redundancy of phrases. General phrases and insignificant elements are often used, which contradicts the main principle of creating an abstract – informativeness.

The structure of the abstract is similar to the structure of a scientific article. We recommend including the following main elements in the abstract: relevance; statement of the problem; description of the object of research; solution of the problem; conclusions; practical significance. We ask you to pay special attention to the presence of conclusions, and not just a description of what the article is about!

Parameters: font size — 12 pt, style — light, straight, alignment – by width, paragraph indent — 10 mm, the interval after is one line.

5. Keywords. 8-10 words or fixed phrases by which the article will be searched in the future. They reflect the specifics of the topic, the object and the results of the study.

Parameters: font size — 12 pt; the style for the phrase «ключевые слова:/keywords:» is bold, italic, for keywords – light, straight; alignment – by width; paragraph indent – 10

mm; The interval after is one line. Keywords are separated from each other by semicolons, and a period is placed at the end.

The abstract is typed in size 12 pt, the alignment is to the width of the page, the paragraph indent is 1 cm. Main Forms and Directions of Interaction of the Republic of Belarus and the Shanghai Cooperation Organization

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The article is devoted to the study of development of interaction between the Republic of Belarus and the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO). The stages of development of interaction are established in accordance with the status of the country in the organization. The directions of interaction between the Republic of Belarus and the SCO are considered. Basic directions of interaction were determined by the Memorandum on granting Belarus the status of a dialogue partner in the SCO in 2010. Several priority areas of cooperation were determined after 2016. It is established that the forms of interaction depend on the status of the country in the organization, and that the Republic of Belarus has made full use of the opportunities offered by a particular status. **NO HYPHENATION.**

6. Text of the publication. The volume of the text is 4-6 pages of A4 computer format, including metadata. The text should not contain undisclosed abbreviations (except for commonly used ones), words should be written in full. Abbreviations are allowed: etc., i.e., cm, km, as well as when specifying specific dates: y. or yy. (2012, 1994-2009); centuries are indicated in Roman numerals and with abbreviations: VI century (or XIX-XX centuries). When Russian names are mentioned in the text, their initials and surname are given, while the initials are indicated before the surname, with spaces (A. I. Ivanov). Quotation marks are only «...», if the word begins the quotation or is adjacent to the end of the quote. Quotation marks "..." are used inside the quotation marks.

For all text, the following parameters are set: A4 page size (Layout / Page Options / Paper Size / A4, Apply: to the whole document); margin size: top = left = right = 2 cm, bottom = 2 cm (Layout / Page Options / Margins, Apply: to the whole document); distance to footer = 1.5 cm (Layout / Page Options / Paper Source / Edge / Footer, Apply: to the entire document).

Font size of the main text — 14 pt, alignment to the width of the page, paragraph indentation 1 cm, line spacing — single, with hyphenation in Russian and Belarusian, also the Russian and Belarusian text should be assigned the language — Russian (highlight the text, Review / Language / Spell check language / Russian). WITHOUT HYPERCUTTING IN ENGLISH (to do this, select the English text, Paragraph / Position on page / Disable automatic word hyphenation).

In the introduction, a brief review of the literature on the topic of the article should be given (with references in square brackets to sources in the bibliographic list), formulate and justify the purpose of the article, if necessary, indicate its connection with important scientific and practical areas.

References to sources in the text of the work are made by bringing the number in line with the bibliographic list. The number of the source in the list is enclosed in square brackets.

When using information from a source with a large number of pages, it is necessary to indicate in the place of work where the reference to this source is given, the numbers of pages, figures, tables to which reference is given in the article. Such sources are books and electronic publications in *pdf*, *doc* and other page formats. Thus, there *is no need to put pages* in links to Internet publications in html format.

Examples:

[23, p. 17] — here 23 is the number of the source in the list of references, and 17 is the page number;

[26, p. 12, Table 1] — here 26 is the number of the source in the list of references, 12 is the page number, and 1 is the number of the table on page 12.

Information about the sources that were used in the preparation of the article is given in the part «References». It is allowed to cite the same source in the specified list only once.

The list is formed in the order of appearance in the order of appearance of references to sources in the text. The bibliographic list cannot include sources that are not referenced in the text of the work.

When placing several tables in the article, the word *Table 1* (*Table 2*, etc.) is written above **the Table Name** (italics, 12 pt, alignment to the right edge of the page, 1 empty line is separated from the previous text).

If there is only one table in the article, then the word *Table* is not written above the **Table Name**.

Directly above the table is placed **The name of the table** (12 pt, **bold**, in the center without paragraph indent) is separated from the upper border of the table by one empty line.

The header in the table is 11 pt, and the text is 12 pt.

Notes. J_{sc} is the short-circuit current density, U_{xx} is the open-circuit voltage, ξ is the I-V duty cycle; R_{max} is the maximum power output, τ is the carrier change in maximum power compared to reference samples.

The source, the note to the table is separated from the bottom border of the table and the subsequent text by one blank line.

If necessary: formulas are typed in size 14 pt in the MathType editor (Insert / Object / Object / MathType); 1 blank line is inserted from the text at the top and bottom; aligned in the center without paragraph indentation:

$$P_{\max} = \frac{X_i}{p_1} \sqrt{b^2 - 4ac},$$

where X_i is the decipherment; p_1 — decryption; b — decipherment; etc. (the decoding of symbols to the formula is placed on the next line below the formula in the order of succession in the formula separated by a semicolon, without paragraph indentation).

Figures are separated from the previous text with one blank line.

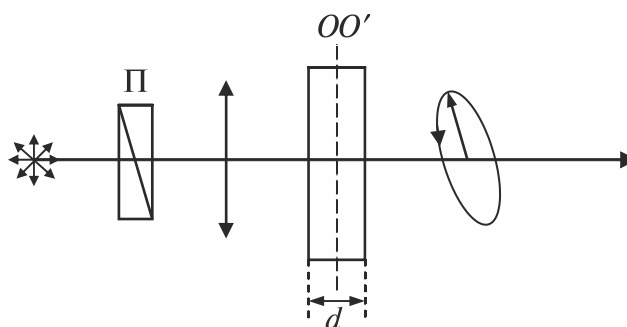


Fig. 2. Title of the figure

The figure is followed by a caption (12 pt, centered without paragraph indentation, the figure is beaten off with one blank line, from the text after the blowing text is beaten with one blank line).

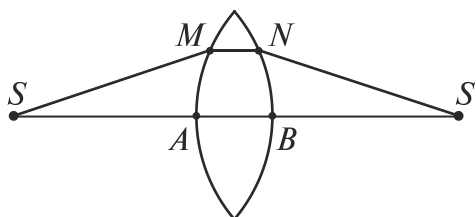


Fig. 2. Title of the figure

When placing several figures in the article, the caption under the figure caption should be written: Fig. 1. The name of the drawing (*Fig. 2*, etc.).

The word *Fig. 1* is italicized, the name of the figure is straight.

If there is only one figure in the article, then the word Fig. is not written.

Any table or figure must have references after it. References must be accompanied by the word «Source».

For example:

«Source: [23, p. 65]»,

«Source: the author's own development according to [3, p. 12]».

9. References. The list of sources is placed at the end of the article and numbered in the order in which they appear in the text of the article.

Parameters: font size — 12 pt, style — light, straight, alignment — width, paragraph indent — 10 mm, line spacing — single.

(the phrase **References** — lowercase letters, center-aligned, without a paragraph)
